

The SUMMER TECHNICAL RECRUITING INTERNSHIP PROGRAM (TRIP)

The Air Force is currently looking for engineering students interested in an internship opportunity that allows them to work for the Air Force Research Lab (AFRL) during the summer between their sophomore and junior year of college.

Selected interns will work at various Air Force bases throughout the United States, for a 10 week period. In addition to paying interns a salary of approximately \$4,500, the Air Force will also pay for round-trip airfare, lodging and living expenses and rental vehicle costs.

Students who complete the program may be offered a follow-on AFROTC scholarship. This scholarship can pay full tuition and fees, an annual \$900 textbook allowance and up to a \$500 nontaxable monthly stipend.

Not only does this program offer the benefits of résumé-worthy experience, competitive pay and scholarship opportunity, it also lays the foundation for career opportunities as either an Engineering Officer in the United States Air Force, or Department of Defense Civilian Employment with the Air Force Research Laboratory.

Paid Summer Engineering Internships



Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for the Summer TRIP students MUST:

- Be enrolled at a university or college that offers Air Force ROTC
- Have completed at least 60 semester or 90 quarter hours of study, prior to the start of the internship
- Be able to graduate within 2 or 3 years after the completion of the internship
- Be a United States citizen prior to the start of the internship
- Not contracted with any branch of the US Military
- Be registered with Selective Service*
- Be at least 17 years of age by the end of the internship
- Complete a medical questionnaire
- Be age 30 or less at end of graduation year
- Meet Air Force height/weight standards
- Have at least a 2.5 cumulative college GPA
- Be majoring in one of the following Engineering Fields:
 - Electrical Engineering
 - Computer Engineering
 - Environmental Engineering

PAID SUMMER ENGINEERING INTERNSHIP

Want to get paid for working with cutting-edge technology during your summer break?

Selected students will be paid a salary of approximately \$4,500.00 during a 10-week internship at one-of-six Air Force Research Labs, located throughout the United States. The Air Force will also pay for round-trip airfare, lodging and living expenses (approximately \$6,000) and rental vehicle costs.

Students who complete the program may be offered a follow-on AFROTC scholarship for the remaining 2-3 years of their degree program. This scholarship pays 100% of tuition and fees, \$900.00 per year for books and you get a \$450.00 to \$500.00 tax-free monthly stipend. Total value of the internship and scholarship is up to \$150,000.
